DESCRIPTION : With U.S. Troop Carrier Forces In Belgium.
Her war -scarred fuselage flapping in the winter breeze, "Old Canvas Sides", a U.S. Troop Carrier Forces glider, flew back to her home base today from Bastogne to thumb her blunt plexi-glass nose at glider experts.
Airborne specialists said gliders could only make one way trip in combat with little or no chances of surviving more than one landing. But, "Old Canvas Sides" came back - not from one, but three airborne operations.
The veteran glider made her maiden combat flight when she landed with a cargo of Infantrymen on Cherbourg Peninsula in the Allied invasion of Normandy.
Because of staked and water covered fields and night landings, few gliders survived the Cherbourg operation. But when glider recovery teams of Maj.Gen. Paul L. Williams Troop Carrier Forces went to work, they found "Old Canvas Sides" ready to return to her base in England, and that she did.
After several months of training flights with green glider pilots "Old Canvas Sides" made her second combat flight in the biggest aerial troop operation in history - the Airborne landings in Holland in mid-September of last year.
Carrying a Jeep and radio equipment, the glider landed her cargo safely in spite of heavy anti-aircraft fire and mortar bursts which dotted the landing fields.
Although her fuselage was punctured by small arms fire and damaged by a rough landing, "Old Canvas Sides" again flew back from the battle field, this time, to a Troop Carrier Base in France.
Her battle damage repaired by the glider mechanics, "Old Canvas Sides" rested her steel framed body in the mud of a French field until the German winter offensive in Belgium isolated the 101st Airborne Division at Bastogne.
Parachutes were first used to supply the airborne troops, but heavy equipment was needed, so "Old Canvas Sides" and sister gliders were used to land artillery shells, gasoline and oil and medical surgical teams.
The battle-tried glider lay in a field outside Bastogne a month before it was found in a snow bank by a glider reclamation party headed by Major Hugh Nevins, Kansas City, Mo.
Flown by 2nd Lt. Frank J. Hynes, Minneapolis, Minnesota, and 2nd Lt. Charles L. Brema, Union City, New Jersey, veterans of 3 airborne invasions. "Old Canvas Sides" was picked up by a C-47 flown by Capt. Clifford F. Harris, Minneapolis, Minnesota, 1st Lt. Raymond L. Warren, Boise, Idaho, to make probably what will be her last trip back from a battle area.
But the glider may make one more long trip, Colonel Glynn M. Jones, New Orleans, La., Chief Of the U.S. Troop Carrier Forces operations may send "Old Canvas Sides" back to the States.

Sec. chief Sgt. Dick Goldston, Earth, Texas, receives orders by phone from the battery commander, and relays it to Cpl. Dewey Cannon, of Oxford, Miss., who sets his sights and the crew immediately load the shell into the breech, fire orders are given and the rounds are fired.

When the 50,000th round comes, the crew marks the particular shell and sends it on it's way to the town of Brand-schied, Germany.

DESCRIPTION : The following coverage was shot on an emergency wire assignment after a standard wire laying Weapons Carrier had twice bogged down on the job and stalled in the over-flooded Saar Valley on the main highway to Saarlautern, Germany. The Weasel featured was just acquired by this Division and rigged up for wire laying in the manner illustrated, an entirely new method of employing this comparatively new vehicle. This technique is now in the process of experimentation on the Western Front, and the flooded terrain in this sector offered an ideal opportunity for studying the new job in action against a flood problem. Sequences show how the weasel made out in putting in 700 yard gap of wire torn out the night before by high winds and flood waters.

Roll 1
LS Of flooded road in Saar Valley. Weasel tears into frame and churns through water left to right exiting in back view. LS of Weasel racing through water head on. Pan shot of Weasel on dry road passing signs and cross road, exits frame right.
LS Weasel leaves dry road and splashes through inundated stretch, camera pans vehicle crew as it goes by.
LS Of Weasel racing across flooded valley following tree line of submerged road. (Bad concertina jar occurred here and cameraman was obliged to switch to bomb spotter.)

Roll 2
Pan shot of Weasel approaching severed wire and hitched to tree. Camera moves in as crew draws to stop, grab wire and start splicing operation. CU of two wiremen stripping wire ...insert of wire and hands, re-establishing shot of Weasel and crewmen still working, followed by change of angle.

Roll 3
Splice is completed on re-establishing shot and Weasel moves on with wire reel, spinning out behind. Pan shot as Weasel goes by, shows men poking wire up on trees.

Roll 4
Pan medium shot as Weasel goes by with camera panning down to revolving wire reel.

Roll 5 & 6
Sequence on crew hitching wire to bridge, followed by splicing on again to other end of wire gap. Men then test splice, turn Weasel around in water, and speed off with job completed, racing through flooded valley like miniature paddle steamer in distance.

NOTE: Just about everything that could go wrong shooting a story occurred on this assignment. Both cameras jammed, necessitating the pulling out of footage on the magazine job twice, and on the bomb spotter three times.

The plasma was wrapped in OD blankets and white cloth, to identify it, was attached. It was loaded on the plane, and they took off. (Sequences shot by other cameraman show plane taking off and landing)

Plane in the air, shot from other plane, circling stranded area. Flare comes from Co. C.P. ~~(del. sequence)~~

Shot of plasma falling not shown.

Plasma on ground as GI comes out of woods and picks it up. View of Echternach from air, smoke from shells rising to sky. Assault craft drifting down Sauer River. The blast is German Artillery in lower left corner of frame in one shot. "Air very bumpy", making situation worse.

Phosphorus and 155mm shells hitting pill boxes on hill overlooking Echternach, Lux.

Two Liaison planes coming back from dropping blood plasma to GIs across the Sauer River in Germany. Cub planes were the only means of getting supplies to the soldiers, for no bridges had been thrown across the River, because of the heavy German gun fire plus swift flood waters of the River. These are Artillery liaison planes of the ~~Inf. Div.~~ near ~~Echternach, Lux.~~ They had to use the road as a runway because of the soggy field. This was shot in conjunction with another cameraman T/4 Harding.

ROLL 2

H.F. and phosphorus shells and Mortars bursting on hill side across Sauer River from Echternach, Lux. On the hill are concealed pill boxes of the Siegfried Line. In the foreground are the wrecked house tops of Echternach.

A Self Propelled 155mm gun moving up a street in Echternach, Lux., to blast German pill boxes of the Siegfried Line across the Sauer River with point blank fire.

One of the Liaison planes that we had photographed earlier in the day, brought down by enemy small arms fire on the edge of Echternach, Lux. This plane was returning from dropping supplies to our soldiers across the Sauer River. The pilot, Lt. John Staley, Frederick, Maryland although wounded did a splendid job of landing the plane in a soggy plowed field. It was so muddy the wheels almost buried themselves. MS Members of Coy, Royal Engrs as they probe around one of two 500 lb bombs that were placed at each side of the bridge leading into town. Germans were driven out before they had time to detonate the bombs.

LS Looking down main street with Frail tank in b.g.

ROLL 5 (MCCAUGHEY, roll 188)A

MCS Regt as they file down street and prepare to go in for another attack.
