ROLL NO. Synopsis. Commandos and tanks of the 19 Lancers and 25 pdrs. of ... Field Regiment R.A. this morning are embarking from AKYAB to assault MYEBCN where they will consolidate and concentrate on outting with Jap L. of C. The entire jetty is a hive of activity with the Commandos in fine fettle, this being their first attack on the Japanese in any force.

Synopsis. Commandos supported by an air strike and elements of the RIN consisting of sloops and MLs, landed south of MYEBON on the morning of 12th January.

Mp.

Opposition, artillery fire, mortars, beach mines, and small arms fire was encountered. Aircraft bombed and straffed and sloops fired salvo after salvo from their gums into the Japanese positions, pricr to the landings.

The first wave of commandos landed in shallow water, but the second wave found themselves more than waist deep in sand and mud. The first Sherman tank to be disembarked from the LCT was bogged in the mud. Casualties were inflicted on the Commandos and serious cases were operated on, on board a sloop of the Indian Navy.

1,2 & 3

Shots taken on board an ICM of the sloops firing, the shells and bombs bursting on the land, the southern tip of MYEBON during and after the shelling and air strike.

4,5 & 6 Shots of Commandos leaving LCMs and wading more than waist deep to the shore. Explosions on the beach (either beach mines or heavy mortars) A Sherman tank leaving LCT and sinking into the mud. Commandos embarking into LCMs from a minesweeper.

Sloops of RIN have been shelling Japanese positions continually and it was found that ammunition was getting low on each sloop.

At the time this sequence was taken, over 2,000 rounds had been fired by these ships. It was decided to transfer remaining rounds to one sloop in order that the other could return to base to refuel. Owing to the danger of air attack, the switch was effected with utmost speed, and officers of both ships assisted the orew to carry the shells from one sloop to the other.

A gangway is placed between the two sloops and the shells are transferred and dumped on the deck.

Elements of 25 Ind. Div. continued to reinforce the Commandos on EASY HEACH, MYEBON. Mail for the troops was landed also.

Troops landing from LCMs onto EASY BEACH. Transport has great difficulty in rounding a point with lumps of rock as a "road".

Moving 25 pdrs. in the area of MYEBON would prove a difficult task, owing to the rough and hilly terrain, so these guns were left on board the Landing Craft which brought them from AKYAB. The Landing Graft was grounded and when the tide went out she was left high and dry on the sand, and formed a perfectly steady base for the four guns. So far as is known this is the first time the guns have been in action using a Landing Graft as a platform,
