SUBJECT : Civilians Salvage Food - Destruction of Cologne.  
UNIT : SPX - G  
CAMERAMAN : Albertson, Capt. McEdward, OIC.  
LOCATION : Cologne, Germany

DATE : 7 March 1945

DESCRIPTION : ROLL 1 (100 ft.) Different shots of civilians in warehouse district near River, pushing loads of foodstuffs they have salvaged.  
Civilians bringing food out of warehouse.  
Pan and stationary shots showing destruction and condition of streets and buildings. (To cut in with scenes shot by Drell and Ridgell).  
ROLL 2 and 3 (800 ft.) The following high angle shots were made from the top of what used to be the water works in center of city, with Eyemo on tripod.  
The first Roll was shot under adverse light conditions. When the sun finally broke through at 1530 hours, same scenes were re-shot with good light.  
Pan and stationary high shots showing desolation and almost complete destruction of city, yet with the Cathedral, from this distance, apparently undamaged.  
Pan shots start on southern part of city, panning L to the Cathedral. Then starting with the Cathedral, camera pans L to the Opera House and western part of the city.  
Also stationary shots to the west, north and east.

COLOGNE

Air to ground shots show some of the devastation in Cologne. In addition to the predominantly industrial areas, residential areas are also seen to have suffered tremendously; it is now known that the Germans, in their efforts to decentralise and protect industrial premises from bombing, were using large numbers of private dwellings as workshops.

Shots include:-

A factory centre north of the Hohenzollern bridge.

Low angle shot of a train burning in a marshalling yard in the North west of the city, in the NIIPES district.

The old town around the cathedral.
