3.	Meanwhile British troops took possession of the town & barracks and rounded up troops, officers & Nazi officials. Shots of Germans coming out of building with hands behind heads and then in line are the considered Nazi enthusiasts, amongst them being an admiral grey hair semi close up Admiral Wagner a supposed friend of Hitler's.				
4.	German officer on steps & walking slowly down is Col General Jedl typical Von Stromheim Prussian general. Various shots of troops & officers being searched for arms etc and also men the march are members of the S.S.

Various High Command officers coming out of the H.Q., including some of the secretaries. The grey haired naval officer is Admiral Wagner.. General Jodl is seen coming down the steps and later driving away in a British staff car.				
2.	Roll 2. The arrival at the British headquarters in Flensburg of General Jodl and Admiral Doenitz. The group in the Courtyard L to R, Speer the armaments chief, Grand Admiral Doenitz and Col/Gen Jodl. The castle where the class 2 prisoners will be temporarily held.				
3.	Roll 3. Scenes of the Castle, German ships in the lake <i>Sea</i> estuary. The German Naval H.Q. now has the three naval flags of the three Allied powers flying. In the building is von Friedeberg after he had committed suicide by taking poison. It was he who signed the surrender surrender with Montgomery.

SUBJECT

THE END OF THE GERMAN FLE NSBURG GOVERNMENT .
BRITISH ARMY MAKE ARRESTS.

May 23rd, 1945.

Under the command of Bri. General J.E. Churcher D.S.O., the 159 Infantry Brigade of the 11th Armoured Division makes a swoop on the so-called Flensburg Government; he is seen directing from Armoured car. His men arrest German Officers on the road.

He is assisted by Lt. Col Corbett a British Officer serving with S.H.A.E.F. General view of the command post for the operation.

At the Ober Kommando der Wehrmacht Head Quarters our troops start searching and arresting. The Government is arrested and marched out of the building under Infantry guard, with their hands on their heads.

They are lined up. 1. Rear Admiral Vagner (without hat) 2. Major Presler with Iron Cross, 3. General Von Trutha.

Shot from above, line of prisoners fourth from left is Foreign Minister Graf Schwerin von Krosigk, (in civilian clothes)

Some of the Marine German guards being marched off. Major General Jodl arrested, he waves goodbye to his staff.

Some of the women secretaries, one holds a pet dog, older one is Admiral Doenitz's secretary. Tanks keep guard on the arrests. Last four in line in uniform are members of German General Staff. Line of Class 1 prisoners awaiting transport these include German Army Command and members of Government. Many hundreds of German Officers and men were arrested too.

At the British Brigade, H.Q. Admiral Doenitz the new Fuehrer arrives under arrest. Shots of civilian. Dr. Speer, Minister of War Production and head of Todt. Admiral Doenitz, new Fuehrer, Soldier Major General Jodl, German Chief of Staff. Opening shot of above walking out, various shots and q/a's. Shots of the port of Flensburg, also Union Jack flying over H.Q.

High Germans under arrest arriving at British H.Q. have to carry their own bags. This is Himmler's car but we have not got him yet. Germans being marched to P.O.W. camps.
