A shall bridge, besides which is a Jap gum. The road winds over the hillside as rain pours down. Jungle at the side of the road battered by our guns. Local workers helping to repair the road.

Mawchi & miles. The Sittang bridge (60 ft. long) is the longest bridge built bybthe Sappers during the whole of the Burma Campaign.

The Mawchi Road is carved through thick jungle along a tortuous route. At the present time it is raining there for about 16 hours a day. Traffic is one-way and controlled by M.Ps at traffic control points. Madrassi Sappers and Miners are playing a big role. They have built more than 60 bridges and by their skilled labour have considerably improved the line of communication. They are always coveredby mortars in case of Jap raiding parties. In this picture I' mortars are giving covering fire. At 24 M.S. there is a swift running chaune varying from 60 ft. to 200 ft. The water is very deep and rough so a small ferry has been started to carry the men across. Now they are building a new bridge across the Thaukyetag River. The advance has slowed down considerably as the result of the difficult terrain and monsoon weather.

No
