YANKS IN ENGLAND GO TO COLLEGE.

At Shrivenham, Berkshire, the American army has established a University for three thousand, aix hundred men waiting to return to the States. In two hundred and fifty courses students will be instructed by leading Prefessers.

The war interrupted the education of millions of men, a mis-fortune which this University and others set up across the Atlantic seek to remedy. The most popular course teaches business administration. Nearly a thousand men have chosen it. Fewer students, but a good many never-the-less, are taking the Art courses.

Surveyors are promised an enormous field in post-war reconstruction and will be in big demand. As for egriculture a hungry world, more food conscious than ever before, indicates prosperity for farmers.

Now that the Axis is beaten the fighting men of yesterday are urgently needed to reatore a war-weary world. Soldiers' Universities will help them on the way.
