1.	The Control Commission for Germany considers amongst the main necessities for a quick reconstruction of Germany, the maintenance of Law and Order. There is now established near Munster a central school for the training of former German Police personnel who will later train Germans as police-				
2.	men. The object is to get a Force in operation as soon as possible. The aim is to have an efficient Force in about six months; an equivalent training would have taken about three years in peace-time England. The staff of the school is entirely composed of Metropolitan Police Officers. Some of these Officers have come straight from England whilst others have				
3.	been in the Army in other capacities during the war. The object of the School is to give the pupils a months course and to get them to work as much as possible on British lines. Any Nazi procedure is eliminated but existing German laws are retained. It has been found that only a very small percentage of German Police laws were Nazi. The men are 'screened'				
4.	by Field Security Police before being admitted to the school. The men come from all parts of British Occupied Germany. There is a similar system going on in the American Zone, but nothing is known of anything in this line in the Russian sector. The school is situated at the H.Q. of the former Motor Gendarmerie of Westfalia (the road police).				
5.	The school is under the direction of Assistant-Inspector-General Ogden, of H Division Metropolitan Police; he is seen inspecting the recruits on the parade ground. The men still wear, where possible, their uniforms and their pre Nazi military decorations such as Iron Crosses. The Physical Training is taken by a German instructor but Lt/Col Farthing is seen				
6.	supervising, he was formerly Chief Inspector of the 3rd District N.E. London, Mobile Police. Capt Tucker formerly of the Special Branch and C Division assists at the instruction on Traffic control. "What to do at a street accident" is supervised by Major Yell formerly of R Division and Peel House. The Instructor is German. This is an entire record of				
7.	all the outdoor activities, the rest is class room work. Other scenes show the entrance to the School. The police will not be armed. The main change aimed at in the training is to get the police to be the servants of the public and not the rulers of the public; this is the main difference between the British and former German methods.
