off the north west coast of Canada the salmon fleet is netting the biggest hauls of all time. The annual two-month season has opened in great style. A big proportion of the world's supply is caught in the icy coastal waters of British Columbia as the fish swarm up the rivers to mann. There's very little skill required in this sort of fishing. The waters teeming with salmon, and into the nets they come as fast as they can be hauled aboard. (SV sort. If aftr under water)

Twenty four hours after each catch is landed the salmon are cooked and canned, ready for expert. Most of the sea-harvest is destined this year for the continent of Europe. It's a god-send that the catchess this autumn are three times bigger than in any of the war years.

Some of the supply will come to Britain, so there is no reason why anyone who can muster 32 points shouldn't have a tin of salmon some time in the next twelve months.
