

During the war, Plexiglas turrets protected our air force gunners. Today Plexiglas is being adjusted to peacetime uses -- such as this modern hassock. All this is seen in a glittering new plastic boudoir designed by Rohm & Haas, makers of Plexiglas. In the air-conditioned sleeping section, even the mural is Plexiglas.

Plexiglas, developed during the war, has not been available to civilians before now. It can be molded at low temperature glued and cut with a saw. Designs carved on its surface glow with light when the panel is lit from the edges. Plexiglas is lighter than aluminum, and almost impossible to break. On the hat-tree in this dream-suite, there's even a selection of plastic hats.
