WAR CRIMINALS AWAIT TRIAL

Nuremberg Court Building, from which Justice was banished long before Bomber Harris purged the courtroom, is in process of rebuilding for the trial of the major Nazi War criminals. Broadcasting booths are being installed so that the world may follow the proceedings.

A covered passage has been erected from the jail to the courtroom thus ensuring that the criminals are screened from sight until they face their accusers from the dock.

For twenty minutes of each day the prisoners are allowed exercise.

Inside the jail heavy nets mard against suicidal death leaps.

Constant vigilance prevents any attempt at escape.

At long last the names of the gangsters of the Third Reich appear in fitting setting... On the doors of common felons cells.

Coulty of vislating every law of human society, these criminals

face demoncratic justice.

With growing impatience the world awaits the trial, not as a long drawn demonstration of democratic legal play but as a swiftly closing chapter in the lives of history's most eval men.

TOP HAZIS AWAIT WAR QUILT TRIAL AT NURUMBERG.

In bombed-out Nuremberg, preparations go forward for the trials of Germany's major war criminals ... and the shrine of Hitler's Naziism becomes its tomb.

In Nuremberg's court building, where the trials will be held, German prisoners work at enlarging and rebuilding the courtroom. Under American supertition, they install broadcasting booths and press facilities to carry the proceedings throughout the world.

Robert H. Jackson, Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, made preliminary arrangements for the trials. From the jail to the courtroom, a covered corridor has been erected. The war criminals will be screened from sight except in the courtroom - protected and saved for the disposition of United Nations justice. The big names of Hitler's Third Reich are kept under heavy guard.

Twenty minutes daily, the prisoners walk out of doors. Constant vigilance prevents attempts at suicide or escape. Heavy nets guard against death-leaps. The prisoners are kept in common cells.
