1.	Operation Stork is the code name given to the evacuation of German children from the British Sector of Berlin, to the country areas of Westfalia and Oldenburg. Attached is an official hand-out. The operation is entirely British, there has been no counterpart in the other sectors. The idea of the scheme is to relieve the suffering from cold and lack of food in Berlin during the winter. The scheme, so far, is voluntary; and it is hoped to evacuate about 50,000 children. The areas to which the children are being sent are rich from an agricultural standpoint. The scheme is somewhat similar to that put into use in England in 1939.

3.	Roll 1. Some of the reasons for leaving Berlin. Children play in the ruins and queue with their Mothers for Milk and other such things. Roll 2. Mothers registering their children at the office to have them evacuated.				
4.	Roll 3. Children playing in the streets. Arriving at the school for the departure. (Early morning) Roll 4. Mothers and children arriving at office to register. Queuing for milk & bread. Children playing in ruins.				
5.	Roll 5. Prior to departure; Medical inspection, Delousing and serving soup. Roll 6. Children eating their last meal in Berlin before next summer. Leaving the school in the German Post busses. Roll 7. The Convoy on the Avus track and then on the Autobahn, going through the Russian sector.				
6.	Roll 8. Scenes on the Autobahn. The Convoy commander in a 'Dingo'. Crossing the frontier from the Russian zone to the British zone in the evening. Roll 9. Entraining on the Hospital train at Alversdorf.				
7.	Roll 10. Red Cross train arriving at Oldenburg station. Checking papers and another Woman Doctor looking at one of the smaller children. Embussing in T.C.Vs. (Troop Carrying Vehicles) Roll 11. Children in T.C.Vs. A child being taken to her new home in the country.				
8.	Roll 12. Arriving at a small village near Oldenburg in T.C.V. Some of the children being greeted at their new home, an old country house.
