35 milos from Singapore in the China Sca, is the Island of Rampang. Of an area of 55 sq. miles, the Island consists mainly of thickly wooded and densely jungled slopes, and Mosquito ridden swamps. To this island are going 120,000 Japanese officers and men who surrendered at Singapore. Each morning at first light, Japanese coastal ships, manned by Japanese crews, leave Singapore for their place of exile. Equipped only with shovels, Adzes and tree axes the Japs have to build their own huts after clearing away the junglo. Transported 500 men at a time in one ship, the Japs have landed about 3,000 men in the last three days. The coasters sail in convoys usually consisting of two ships and are superintended by Motor launches under the command of Commander Villiers, D.S.C., R.N.V.R. (The Royal Navy are not escorting the convoys, nor are they helping the Japs ashore). The Aki Maru, a vessel of the Coaster type, stands off the Southern tip of the Island and is the Japanese Naval H.Q. Ship. Already, the Japs have cleared an area of approximately half a square mile of jungle and aro. pushing out a jetty 50 yards long. The Jetty is being wholly constructed of wood that is felled locally on the Island by the Japs. For Pile-drivers, the Nips have constructed large hammors by nailing four strong wooden arms onto the roughly shaped sides of wooden blocks 18" x 12" made from local timber. One Jap takes each arm of the hammer, and they hoist and lower the 'Pile-driver' to the tune of a Japanese song. Their huts are very crude types and are made from boughs of trees covered with Coconut Fronds and itiled' with tiles made from the bark of trees. To obtain the bark, a slit is made in the bark of the selected tree, and a strip about nine inches long is slowly and carefully peeled off. To build a hit, the Japs big a wooden framework over the flag, cover three sides and the roof with Coconut Fronds and then tile the roof with bark. The cuts are rapidly made and will accommodate ten men. The long side facing into the hillside is left open and does duty as door and windows for the hut. Steps cut into the clay of the hillside are reinforced with wooden struts, but are rapidly worn out making the journey up the hill a back breaking task. Two store sheds are built on the shore now, and others are being constructed further inland. This first clearing is on the Northern end of the Island and constitutes their Landing Stage and Warohouse Area. Two miles to the South of the first camp, they are building the main residential camp area to accommodate further troops that arrive. · · · · · · · · · · · · · · ·

In the early hours of the morning before the dawn breaks, 1,000 Japanese prisoners leave their camp at Kluang on Singapore Island: to march down to Clifford Pier to embark for Rempang Island, (See sheet one), Guarded by Indian troops of the 2/9 Jats Regt. the Nips arrive at their port of embarkation at 0600 hours each morning. Two coastal tranp steamers manned by Japanese crews are waiting at the dockside and the Japs are marched straight on board. The only kit they are allowed to take is what they can.carry in their packs, some of which reach collossal proportions. The journey from Singapore to Rempang Island - uninhabited before the Japs came - takes the ancient coasters 11 to 12 hours.
