OPENING OF WATERLOO BRIDGE

LV Herbert Morrison speaks:-

1 "Chairman of the council, Mr. Mayor of Westminster, Mr. Mayor of Lambeth, Ladies and Gentlemen. I am very very glad this morning to open the new Waterloo Bridge and when I have finished these very few words I will proceed to cut the tape and declare the new Waterloo Bridge open,

the demolition of the old historic Waterloo Bridge which had its great beauty and attraction

SV Herbert Morrison:-

2 to the people of London and for admirers of ancient monuments was built by Rennie who was an engineer but an engineer who also functioned as an architect. The time came when Rennie's bridge became shaky and it had to be propped up. There followed ten years of keen discussion argument and debate between equally sincere people as to what should be done about the bridge and finally after these ten or eleven years had past it was decided to demolish the old bridge which was narrow and which was difficult for navigation and to substitute a new one and the new one is now here."

LENS CHANGE

SV Morrison:-

".....very very little and I was a few yards from the bridge when a bomb came through it nevertheless it stood up and it survived and perhaps it is one of the most remarkable things in the history of ~~warfare~~ air warfare that our Thames' bridges survived the German assault. It is perhaps a testimony both to the efficiency of the air defence of Great Britain and to the inefficiency of Field Marshall Goering's Nazi Airforce. Anyway....."

LV Morrison:-

3 "....to the council that I should be permitted to perform this opening ceremony and I am very glad that there are with me the former chairman of the highway committee Mr. South and the former chairman of the finance Committee, Lord Latham who were partners and collaborators with me in a great battle which left no great wounds a battle which has now resulted in an almost universal acquiescence in the view of the new bridge as a fine bridge well worthy of the capital city of the British Commonwealth of Nations. Mr. Chairman I thank you for your kindly welcome and I will now proceed to cut the tape which signifies the official opening of the new Waterloo bridge. (applause)."
