

## ZULU WARRIORS DANCE FOR KING

The biggest Zulu gathering for more than sixty years assembled at ~~Uthmaniyana~~ <sup>Eshawe</sup>, capital of Zululand, in honour of the Royal visit. They came to show the King - the Bayete as they call him - the long famous war dance of their martial race.

Women water-bearers attended the warriors, as in the days when the warlike Zulus struck fear into the hearts of their African neighbours. The Royal train had arrived as the last ~~contingents~~ <sup>bands</sup> of the coloured warriors reached the capital, <sup>apparently</sup> without having ~~worn~~ <sup>worn</sup> themselves to a shadow on the march. It was estimated that there were a hundred thousand native spectators <sup>5</sup> the Royal car drove to the arena. The stage was set for the ~~war-dance~~ <sup>war</sup> dance of the Zulus.
