The Prime Minister was the guest of the Royal Air Force at Halton Airfield, Bucks. Marshal of the R.A.F. Lord Tedder escorted him, end-Mr. Noel Baker and the French Chief of Air Staff General Piellot. The visitors were invited to see a demonstration of several types of aireraft on which the R.A.F. is concentrating today.
