PREPARATION FOR DESTRUCTION OF HELIMOLAND.

Heligoland the German Gibralter will have all its fortifications blown up on April 18th. Preparations have been made to destrey the 14 miles of tunnelling. 8000 tens of emplesives have been put in the tunnel including terpedo heads, mines, shells. A quantity of amuunition shells which supplied the batteries will remain in the tunnel. Lt.Com.F. Mildred of London will press the button from a ship about 8 miles away and no one will land on the island until 2 days later in order that the birds should not be destroyed a clock will be set to in give an alarm every half mimute for half hour before the big bang. This is considered to be the biggest man made explosion ever. The town on the island was destroyed by the RAF and not a road remains, very little damage was done to the U boat pens these will be destroyed.

A smoke plane like a giant "E" rose more than 8,000 Feet into the air when the German Fertress Island of Heligoland was blown up this afternoon..... Seenes show the Explosion..., and various leases on the cloud of smake & dust rising.....

Owing to a last minute instruction from the Havy (in charge of the operation "Big Bong") No aircraft were allowed to approach the island after the Employion ... therefore no low level scenes of the Aftermeth were possible ... however, we did eresp in as much as pessible..., and Roll 2 N & S shows the Island after the Explosion There was very little flash to be seen from the height at which I was flying (7,000 feet)....but the Ground camera will probably show the actual flashes better ... Seenes of the Island before the .. Explosion took place were not possible ... because all the Aircraft involved in this operation had to fly around the Island in a clockwise direction ... (hosping the Island on the Starboard beam and as the elegraft in which Iwas flying only had it's Port window removable for Photography ... we had to comply with the instructions laid down ... until half a minute before the Explosion... when we did a quick turn and brought the Island on our Port Beam ... from then onwards we did laft-hand or inti-clockwise circuits of the Island.

DESTRUCTION OF HELICOLAND.

Holigoland was destroyed to-day. The furtifications consisted of schmarine shelter, gan defences and power installations, tunnel systems and underground installations at one o'clock today Lt. Gem. F. Mildred present a button then detenated and caused the explosion, pictres of the explosion were taken from a ship nine miles away.
