INTERVIEW 75-YR-OLD SUFFRAGETTE.

I am now 75 years old. I was in the suffrage movement long ago, and I have been fighting for Women's rights in one way or another practically all my life.

We got the vote, but we were then still a long way off receiving equal pay for equal work, so we went on fighting for that, and now with this vote of the Labour Conference we are a big step nearer our goal.
