Opening the floodgates of the St. Maurice River Dam, Quebec, the graded authorities staved off imminent disaster in the higher beaches of the big river. MR. MR. MARSHALL ADDED THAT THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT CODED NOT SEE ANY OTHER ALTERNATIVE TO THE CARRYING DUT OF A NUMBER OF MEASURES IN THEIR OCCUPATION ZONE IN SOUTHERN KOREA FOR THE CRATION OF A PROVISIONAL DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT OF KOREA.

IN HIS REPER DATED APRIL 19TH, MR. MOLOTOV SALU THAT THE AMERICAN REPRESENTATIVES IN THE JOINT COMMISSION BID NO ADHERE TO THE MOSCOW DECISION ON KOREA OF DECEMBER 1945.

ACCORDING TO THAT DECISION KOREAN DEMOGRATIC ORGANISATIONS WOULD HAVE TO BE DENSULTED, AND MR. MOLGTOV STATED THAT THE AMERICAN REPRESENTATIVES REFUSED TO CONSULT LANGE KOREAN ORCAN CISATIONS IN SOUTH KOREA, BUT ON THE OTHER HAND PROPOSED TO CONSULT ORGANISATIONS WHICH HAD EXPRSED THEIR OPPOSITION TO THE MOSCOW DECISION.

MR. MOLOTOV EMPHASISED THAT IN THE OVIET OCCUPATION ZONE OF NORTH KOREA & CONSIDERABLE PROGRESS HAD DEEN CARRIED OUT IN DEMOCRATISATION AND DEVELOPMENT IN INDUSTRY AND AGRICULTURE. Andrews Abbott Non CANADIAN #84
