The unknown murderer, whose victims were all patients undergoing minor gynæcological operations, is believed to have mixed poison with the patients' medicines after the operations.

As far as the police know he is 'll at large inside the hospital d the pharmacy is being closely guarded.

Another theory is that the maniac came from outside and committed his crimes during visits to the wards.

"I am convinced the present in-

vestigations will lead to nothing." he concluded .- Reuter.
