~~Labour will never become reconciled to this law. The American Federation of Labour will launch an immediate campaign for the prompt repeal of the Taft-Hartly Bill. We believe that the law will prove such a boomerang that its sponsors and supporters will be voted out of office by the American people next year.~~

Truman.

I veto the Taft-Hartly Bill because I am convinced it is a bad bill. It is bad for the Labour, bad for Management, bad for the country. It has taken bargaining power away from the workers and given more power to Management. If we utilise our system of collective bargaining we would gain the opposition of every man in the country.

Taft.

The campaign carried on against the Bill by the Labour Unions has been a complete tissue of falsification to support the contention that Unions are above criticism and above the law that there must be no legislation on the pain of political execution.

This Bill has been called anti-Labour. I deny that. The Bill is both *both* for Labour and Management, but above the rights of Labour and Management it takes into consideration what is in the public interest. We in the Congress are sent here to do the greatest good for the greatest number, and that is what we have done in the enactment of the Taft-Hartly Bill.
