The crowning of the "QUEEN OF CHILDREN'S DAY", it year old Pamela Hopper, by the Lady Mayoress of Leeds, Lady Martin. She is escented to and from the platform by her retinue. Max the Lord Mayor (Sir George Martin), and other high civic and police officals. Run out on sports shots including obstacle race. (here after going under the net the finish is by a short sack race." A finish shot is detailed later. ROLL THREE. More sports scenes, after a short section of girls sports comes an odd shot of the finish of the boys obstacle race to tack on to Rell Two. Broad general views of the natural ampitheatre in Roundhay park, Leeds, in which the event was held, the arena is filled with a massed physical culture display by boys and girls.
	ROLL FOUR. A few crowd shots. gneral view and closer shots of country dancing display. Roll ends on a few crowd cut-ins.
	In windy and somewhat inclement weather, Ledds celebrated CHILDREN'S DAY an exemt unique event in England. In the morning a procession of gaily decor ted vehicles took children in fancy dress from Leeds Town Hall, to Roundhay Park on the outskirts where the main celebrations took place. Many thousands of people turned up(though I am infirmed that the show und crowd was not up to standard, doubtless due to the weather.)
