The Canadian emigration office in London answers hundreds of enquiries a day from men and women willing even to seal up house and home to start again in the Dominion. That is what Mr. & Mrs. Browne, of Dartford, are doing. An engineer, he has a job waiting in Ontario. His wife will follow him when he is settled in.

In the queue at the emigration office, among all types, perhaps the most unlikely person was a 25-year-old Foreign Office typist, Doris Holloway.
