MR HERBERT MORRISON STATED THIS AFTERNOON THAT THE  
MEMBERSHIP OF THE NEW PLANNING BOARD WOULD, HE HOPED,  
BE ANNOUNCED EARLY NEXT WEEK, AND ADDED "I SHALL BE  
MAKING A STATEMENT NEXT WEEK, PROBABLY IN THE HOUSE, IN  
WHICH I WILL EXPLAIN BROADLY WHAT THE TERMS OF REFERENCE  
OF THE PLANNING BOARD ARE AND WHAT ITS DUTIES WILL BE."

MR MORRISON, WHO WAS GIVING HIS FORTNIGHTLY ECONOMIC  
SURVEY, SAID THE GOVERNMENT WAS PROPOSING TO MAKE AN  
ANNOUNCEMENT OF A LONG TERM ECONOMIC PLAN FOR THE COUNTRY. BY  
LONG TERM HE ENVISAGED THREE, FOUR, OR FIVE YEARS --  
NEARER FOUR TO FIVE YEARS.

SO FAR OUR PLANNING HAD BEEN SHORT TERM BECAUSE  
OF THE UNCERTAINTIES AND CHANGING CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE  
IMMEDIATE POST WAR YEARS BUT THEY WERE DRAWING UP A PLAN  
ON LINES AS DEFINITE AS MIGHT BE PRACTICABLE.

"PRELIMINARY ECONOMIC ANALYSIS AND STUDIES HAVE BEEN  
MADE AND THEY WILL BE LAID BEFORE THE NEW PLANNING  
BOARD, ONE OF WHOSE MAIN FUNCTIONS WILL BE TO ADVISE  
UPON THE PROPER NATURE, LIMITS AND DURATION OF THE PLAN" HE SAID.
