For various reasons much of the material wanted was unobtainable either it did not exist, or was impossible to get.

Opens with several shots of Haig Pit where a big disaster occurred in 1910. Various shots of houses with drawn blinds etc. trans the local church with flag half mast (no special services have been held) After a ou of a window with drawn blinds comes a shot with a ruin in the foreground, this is ruin is Wellington pit where some 137 men lost their lives in 1911. It has been closed for 15 years or so now. On the coast beyond can be seen William pit the scene of the present disaster, whilst further bank still -if hase has permitted-is Lowker pit on a headland. I shot a disaster here at the back end of last year. Several shots of the rain of Wellington pite Run out on shot which shows William pit framed by the ruins of Wellington.

The great difficulty on this story was the opposition from the miners towards any pictures showing the bodies etc. We were all (general press etc) allowed in provided that no bodies were shot. The still boys shot none at all, but Gordon finally shot - on the pretext that he was shooting for all and with the manager's permission (which he hadn't) - and scrammed. I hope that nmy pinching (switching the camera on with my shoe toe) is o.k. as I doubt if the long lens stuff will be over good.

In true Coal Board manner, the plans of the mine are top secret however the attached sketch from the Express is a fairly good idea how it works. I suggest something similar for a diagram.

So far unable to get the miners in hospital, firstly they will not play without N.E. consent and secondly they had been doped to make them sleep and the quacks would not permit it anyway in these conditions.

Second shipment tomorrow with background, Haig pit gr aves etc.
