Obersalzberg:

Transformation of a farm.

The buildings on Obersalzberg which were erected for the Nazi leaders and cost hundreds of millions of marks are destroyed. The luxurious villas were destroyed, but Hitler's farm below the "Berghof" is still partly usable, and is now being remodeled into an Agricultural School, which hopes to open next year.

An administrator manages the farm which also has a pig establishment, as well as a stud of "Haflinger" horses.

Higher up in the mountains lies the Rossfeld Alp, belonging to the farm, too.

So the personal property of the Nazis is used for the public.
