Several thousand Trade Unionists converged on the Champs Hysees from several parts of Paris demanding that the bread ration should not be cut. Buses went off the road for an hour in the afternoon to enable the protest to be attended by transport workers. Their example was followed by the Paris Underground, and the Metro closed its gates.
