THE FILM GARDEN PARTY

1. Entrances to event

- (a) Two public entrances on road A297 near Morden Station, Underground.
- (b) "Private entrance" on road A297, South of public entrances. This gives access from main road to "Special Enclosure".
- (c) "Surrey Arms" entrance on road A239 from Mitcham Station towards Morden.

2. Route and car-parking

- (a) Cars from London for "Private Entrance" and "Surrey Arms" entrance are advised to approach via Mitcham Station (S.R.) thence road A239 towards Morden.
- (b) Cars (except those provided with Special Enclosure windscreen stickers) will be directed by police towards car parks near Morden Station, Underground.
- (c) Cars with "Special Enclosure" windscreen stickers will drive into "Private Entrance" to deposit passengers. Car parking space in the enclosure is limited. The majority of such cars must therefore leave enclosure and wait in public car parks after depositing passengers.

3. Use of entrances

- (a) "Special Enclosure" ticket holders should use "Private Entrance".
- (b) "Press" ticket holders may use any entrance, but are requested not to drive cars into "Private Entrance".
- (c) Technical and administrative transport (eg. B.B.C, newsrooms, contractors, bands) must use "Surrey Arms" entrance, since this is the only route by which vehicles can enter the park.

4. Refreshments

Hold~~ers~~ of "Special Enclosure" and "Press" tickets are invited to take refreshments in the Special Enclosure.
