

REFUGEES IN CAMP

The disembarkation of the Exodus refugees has been carried out with far less trouble than was at one *time* expected. Full precautions were taken, and when trains from Hamburg arrived at Eucknitz Station the people came on to the platform without protest. Many, of course, were tired and dispirited after their long voyage, and all were disappointed, that their cherished ambition to enter Palestine had been so far frustrated.

To the camp at Poppendorf nearly three thousand of these unfortunate people ~~had~~ been sent for the time being. *Though* ~~They were mostly~~ much relieved that the weeks of ~~isolation~~ uncertainty were over, Perhaps none of them, as they prepared to make themselves as comfortable as possible, ~~had~~ abandoned hope that before long they ^{would} enter the Promised Land. ~~Years of suffering had entitled~~ *if entitled* them to a country of their own.
