SV Last May I received an order to plough this field of wheat up. They told me I might grow mustard on it. I know this field wont grow mustard on it on account of it growing a whole lot of charlock; so I plan to grow buckwheat.

SGU Now the crop is ready to harvest I've received an order from the committee to plough in or destroy it. But this I refuse to do. However, they sent a tractor along and ploughed 9 acres of it in. But the N.F.U. stopped this.
