48 Dakotas took aboard an airborne battalion—
group, a good sprinkling of Arnhem veterans among them,
at the beginning of a combined Army - R.A.F. manoeuvres,

Observers at Netheravon Airfield, Wiltshire, included military attaches of all European countries except Russia.
