

## WALLABIES BEAT UNITED SERVICES

MR BEVIN HAS NOW IT IS UNDERSTOOD SANCTIONED AGREEMENT TO THE CONDITIONS PUT FORWARD BY THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT SOME DAYS AGO FOR THE RECEPTION INTO FRANCE OF THE JEWISH REFUGEES FROM THE THREE BRITISH TRANSPORTS AT HAMBURG. THERE WAS SOME CONFUSION LAST NIGHT AND EARLIER TODAY, EVEN AT BRITISH CONTROL COMMISSION HEAD-QUARTERS IN HAMBURG ON REPORTS OF A NEW DIRECTIVE TO BE ISSUED BY THE FOREIGN SECRETARY FOR RE-DRAFTING THE REFUGEES TO ANOTHER AREA NOT SPECIFIED.

THESE REPORTS WERE UNFOUNDED. THE FACTS ARE THAT BRITAIN HAS NOW ACCEPTED THE THREE CONDITIONS LAID DOWN BY THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT.

- 1. THAT IMMIGRANTS SHOULD VOLUNTARILY GO TO FRANCE.
- 2. THAT THE IMMIGRANTS ON THE THREE SHIPS WERE NOT TO HAVE PRIORITY OVER OTHER BATCHES OF JEWS GOING INTO FRANCE FOR WHOM ARRANGEMENTS HAD ALREADY BEEN MADE.
- 3. THAT THE ADMISSION OF THESE REFUGEES INTO FRANCE SHOULD NOT CAUSE THE TOTAL OF REFUGEES IN FRANCE TO EXCEED

THE 8,000 LIMIT SET BY THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT IN AUGUST 1940.

IN THE LATEST BRITISH REPLY TO THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT IT IS MADE PLAIN THAT THE BRITISH AUTHORITIES IN GERMANY WILL PROCEED AT ONCE WITH ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE DISPATCH INTO FRANCE OF TRAIN-LOADS OF THE REFUGEES WHO WISH TO GO.

BUT THIS CANNOT BE ACCOMPLISHED, IT IS POINTED OUT BY OFFICIALS IN LONDON, UNTIL THE SORTING PROCESS NOW TAKING PLACE IS COMPLETE.
