8. Long shot of truck and bridge over river dumping logs into water.
9. Shot from underneath bridge as logs come tumbling past into river.
10. Shot from underneath bridge as logs come tumbling past into river.
11. Long panover of river jam-packed with logs
12. Semi elev v of boat plowing thru water to keep logs moving into the sorting gap.
13. Ride shot on boat - man in prow pushes logs aside with long boat hook.
14. Ext. CU of bow of alligator boat thru water and logs directly into camera.
15. Long GV of sorting gap
16. Top v of automatic separating log machinery.
17. Powerful streams of water washing off logs.
18. Logs riding down shoot.
19. BV of sort of conveyer belt carrying cut logs to mountainous wood pile.
- 20/ LV same as water is poured on them to prevent combustion
21. Semi CU same
22. GV same.
