LAST TRIBUTE TO PRINCE CHICHIBU - Tokyo

"The coffin of the late Prince Chichibu, younger brother of H.I.M. the Emperor, was carried into a horse-drawn hearse, January 9, by 25 veteran sportsmen, and left the villa at Kugenuma, Kanagawa Prefecture, for Tokyo, to be installed at the Imperial Household Board annex.

"January 12 saw the funeral procession consisting of five carriages quietly leave the temporary resting place in the small rain then prevailing, for the Toshinagaoka Cemetery, through the streets of Tokyo, lined by Tokyoites who desired to pay their last tribute to the soul of the ill-fated Sportsman Prince.

"Here at the Cemetery, sports veterans took the coffin to the altar. Before the presence of Crown Prince, Princes and Princesses of the blood, and high dignitaries of Japanese and foreign countries, the funeral ceremony was started at 9:50 A.M.

"Princess Chichibu, the chief mourner for this occasion, offers the sacred branch, to bid her farewell to her late husband. Crown Prince pays his tribute.

"From 10:50 A.M., the public was permitted to pay theirs. Representatives from various sports organizations to which the late Prince had been connected were among many mourners.

"On January 13, T.I.M. the Emperor and Empress visited their late brother's tomb."
