SPECIAL RELEASE THE EISENHOWER INAUGURATION

The White House — 7:02 P.M. Tuesday, January 20th. The Eisenhowers, President and First Lady, take over their new residence. Ahead are four years in the world limelight. Behind them are the crowded hours of the inaugural day. Etched deep in enduring memory is the matchless tribute they received when they led the parade from the Capitol down Pennsylvania Avenue to the Executive Mansion reviewing stand. It was "Ike Weather" they said: sunny skies, mild temperature, matching the warmth of the salute by hundreds of thousands of onlookers.

After a two-mile triumphant ride, the new President, and vice-President Nixon occupied the White House reviewing stand.

A detachment of veterans of the Korean fighting — and Ike's soldier-son as onlooker soon to rejoin his outfit on that distant front.

Cadets of West Point in cadenced splendor: even as Eisenhower marched for Wilson's inaugural....

Tribute of the wild west — and an impromptu performance; Monte Monte, a cowboy from California, can tell his grandchildren he lassoed the President!

Annapolis Midshipmen — and the floats and banners and delegations of the Sovereign States.

New York's Governor Dewey received a warm response from the Chief Executive...

The life of Dwight D. Eisenhower depicted — and the mood of this memorable day was at no time more apparent.

Just brief hours before, the soldier statesman had passed the most significant milestone of a long career of service.

It was the beginning of Eisenhower's greatest day — and yet for history, the climax

For in the broad plaza of the Capitol building was portrayed the scene which, chroniclers of the time will picturize in countless volumes.

The was the spectacle of inauguration, 1953!

The Paramount News cameras recorded the procession through the Capitol rotunda. Richard Milhouse Nixon, 40 years old, came onto the platform...and then Dwight David Eisenhower, sixty-two 34th president in the republic's 164 years..... first Republican Chief Executive in 20 years; he, who landslided to election victory with nearly 34 million votes.

The moment of change was at hand. First, Vice-President Nixon took the oath of office -- administered by colleague Senator William F. Knowland of California. Then the new President. The oath administered by Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson. Eisenhower's hand rested on the George Washington bible, and on the bible from West Point.

Here, then is the most historic portrait of all....the most dramatic moment of inauguration...

In a matter of seconds General Eisenhower pronounced the 36 words which made him President.....

Congratulations from outgoing President Harry S. Truman....and then for wife Mamie, a kiss "seen around the world."

Finally, President Eisenhower's inaugural address. The pulse of the free world quickened...the tide of history seemed to half, awaiting the first words from a new global leader. Following his own opening prayer, Eisenhower pledged to strive for peace, but to reject appeasement of aggression. He called for unity of free nations, and laid down a 9-point program for the quest to end wars....

Thus did the Capitol witness another change in national leadership, another era had come upon the United States. In the truest tradition of democracy, the moment belonged also to the people, who had given unto one man their greatest gift. And thus, too, with his wife Mamie at his side, the one-time Kansas farm boy took up the challenge of the great hour!

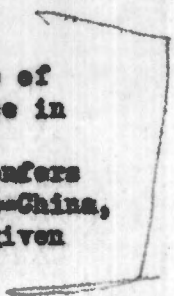
