Teams from Great Britain, U.S.A, France, Austria, Germany, Switzerland, Belgium, Italy, Sweden and Norway took part in a two day run of the Two Man World Bobsled Championships here at Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 24 and 25 January. Winner of the event was the Switzerland No.1. team composed of Endrich and Stockli. Their time for the event was Five Minutes One and Nine Tenths Seconds. (5.01.90) This time is the accumulated running time of four trips down the bob run, two on Saturday and the final two on Sunday. The German No.1. team was second with 5.02.17. This team is made up of Andreas Ostler and Kemser. Ostler was the Captain of the German team which won both two - and four-man bob championships at the winter games in Oslo in 1952. Ostler was leading after the first two runs. At the end of the third the Swiss were leading by 2/100 of a second. The latter increased that lead in the fourth run by 27/100 of a second to win the event. The course is 1650 meters long with a 9% drop with 16 curves. The bobsleds

The course is 1650 meters long with a 9% drop with 16 curves. The bobsleds and men are limited this year to 200 kilograms overall weight which places the accent of the driver's skill rather than the speed gained by added weight. This is the first time since the war the championships have been held on German soil.

Opens with a long shot of German No. II team coming in at end of race. The next shot is a close-up of the two men. The next section of the roll shows Swiss No. I. team of Endrich & Stockli in close-up as they stand at end of race in which they have just won. Here they are congratulated by the German No. II team. The last fifteen feet of the roll shows Ostler and Kemser, Germany No. I. team with the American No. 1. team at end of race. Germany No. I. lost out to Switzerland by a hair.
