HISTORICAL SESSION OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

The VI regular session of the Yugoslav National Assembly proceeded its work by discussing the suggested Constitutional law about elements of social and political organization in federal government organs.

Mr. Edward Kardely gives a report on the new Constitutional Law which was unanimously accepted by the National Assembly. Thus did the new Law, which is to mark a new phase in the life of Yugoslavia, come into force.

On the session following, Mr. Jovan Veselinov suggested that Marshall Tito be one of the candidates for the Presidential place. As no other suggestions were made, access to voting took place. While voting was going on in the Assembly the impatient crowd outside the building waited to hear the result.

The First President - Marshall Tito - is greeted with cheers on entering the Assembly's hall.

One of the most solemn moments was that when the first President laid his oath.

200.000 citizens, standing outside the Assembly, claimed to see and hear and to congratulate Marshall Tito. He satisfied their claim by thanking them for the magnificent meeting and by saying:

"We are all faithful servants of our peoples and our work and endeavours must match their aspirations."
