C.U. Various shots of the parade & marching, slow & ordinary.  
 A couple of shots fairly of King Hussein on parade, he can be identified by the fact that he is wearing a star or decoration on the left of his tunic (right facing the camera), whilst marching he was too far away from the allocated position to get shots. A ~~KK~~ screen filling picture of the two cadets who are to receive the awards..nearest camera Senior Under officer, the Queens Medal, D.R.Walters..the one furthest away from camera is Senior Under Officer G.C. Gordon Lennox who receives the Sword of Honour....a close up looking up is R.S.M. J.C.Lord who gives the cadets the works whilst undergoing their training.  
 Shots of the Adjutant riding up the steps, a time honoured custom.

Could not take pictures of the general taking the salute as he was in ordinary battle dress.

Not allowed on parade ground but for one minute, to get as the press explained, reasonable pictures of the King.

If ~~XX~~ we cover on Thursday, a sound truck is necessary, then in can only be placed behind the public and the ~~XXXXXXXX~~ saluting base which means at least 40 yds from the marching and about 25yds from the general taking the salute.
