

WALES BEAT SCOTLAND

70,000 crowded Murrayfield, with enthusiasm the game itself never lived up to, ⁷ saw Scotland go down on their own ground before the lively Welsh. The visitors dominated the forward play with a heavier pack and the nippy Welsh backs seized most of their chances. After 20-minutes the referee, Dr. ~~W.P.~~ Cooper of England, gave Wales a penalty and the young full-back, T.E. Davies, put the ball well between the posts.

5-minutes before half-time right-wing-three-quarter Ken Jones scored the first try of the game and Wales completed the first half with a 6-nil lead.

The second-half continued to be a tale of missed chances for Scotland. As in the first period full-back Cameron missed a penalty from a scoring position. Had those two kicks got home it might all have been a different story. But after 16-minutes ~~the~~ ^{full-back} the veteran Welsh captain Bleddyn Williams got the ball after fine play by Griffiths and Ken Jones and touched down for the second Welsh try.

Davies ^{got} had no luck with the ~~last~~ kick.

Wales ^{was} led by 9 clear points. In the closing minutes they sealed Scotland's doom with another try. Bleddyn Williams was the scorer again.
