It was extremely difficult to obtain any news at all of the route to be taken by the Duke. Police were most unco-operative. Only at the last moment I learned his intention of going to Bawdsley-- 14 miles away-- Managed to get there in front of him Was extremely lucky in getting onto the ML;
 Lack of room at Green point made it impossible to get any decent stuff -- ie; One narrow track out -- One narrow track back-- either side mud three feet deep- On this hundreds of men had to work; Impossible to stand on the mud -- I tried it, up to my waist.

3.24 PM. ADD: THE DUKE.

THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH MAKING HIS FLYING TOUR OF EAST ANGLIA ARRIVED AT SNOW COVERED MARTLESHAM AERODROME NEAR IPSWICH AT ABOUT 2 O'CLOCK AND DROVE TO BAWDSEY R.A.F. STATION NEAR FELIXSTOWE.

HE THEN BOARDED A ROYAL NAVAL MOTOR LAUNCH FROM HARWICH TO VISIT THE BREACHES IN THE RIVER DEBEN WHERE 800 R.A.F. MEN AND 200 BOYS FROM THE HOLLESLEY BAY BORSTAL INSTITUTION ARE REPAIRING THE 50 BREACHES IN THE RIVER WALL. THE WIDEST BREACH IS 200 YARDS.

THE MEN HAD TO MARCH TWO AND A HALF MILES THROUGH MUD WHICH AT TIMES WAS KNEE DEEP.

THE DUKE WAS WEARING SEA BOOTS AND A RAINCOAT.

ACCOMPANYING THE DUKE WERE THE EARL OF STRADBROKE, LORD LIEUTENANT OF SUFFOLK AND COLONEL A.F. SENIOR, CHIEF CONSTABLE OF EAST SUFFOLK.

ABOUT A DOZEN HOUSEWIVES WHO HAD CROSSED THE FERRY FROM FELIXSTOWE WHERE THEIR HOMES HAD BEEN FLOODED WAVED TO THE DUKE.
