SCOTTISH FORESTRY DISASTER

Haddo House, home of Lord Aberdeen, has evidence of the gale calamity on its own doorstep. Beech trees planted 150 years ago had been uprooted in the grounds. With Major Gordon, Heir to the Estates, the Marquis surveyed the damage, part of the tremendous disaster that afflicted Scotland north of the Caledonian Canal. The hurricane winds that caused the great floods devastated the Scottish forests, incidentally creating new views of Balmoral Castle, formerly hidden by the trees. One-and-a-quarter-million tons of timber, 35-millioncubic-feet, were blown down in a matter of hours. The wood itself will not be wasted; portable sawmills have been brought in to deal with it, but the damage to future timber supplies is great.
