considerable amount of hardwood, mainly Beech with Oak, Elm and Ash has also been destroyed. It will take between ten and fifteen years to clear up and restock but about seventy years before the situation ix will be really back to normal. The immediate problem is that the timber which is down must be cleared up before two years - otherwise there is the danger of deterioration. At the moment, and for the next few months, work will be concentrated in clearing roads and ways into the timber - thereafter it will be possible to attack the main problem.

It is to be noted, of course, that this wood is not wasted and if the imports and marketing are intelligently handled, to safeguard the market prices and distribution, the timber position in Britain need not suffer.
