


Dag Hammarskjöld was on the General Assembly platform of UNO

DAG HAMMARSKJOELD ELECTED  
UNO's NEW SEC-GEN

"Mr. President .. Gen. Assembly's 7th Session I have the great honour to introduce to you Mr. Hammarskjöld, the new Sec.Gen. for the United Nations." (applause)

'The world will little know or long remember what we say here, but it can never forget.' "It is for us, the living, to be dedicated here to the unfinished task which they have thus far so nobly advanced,

It is for us - it is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us. With the greatest..... man does not ask for victory but for peace. I haven't gone to any of the specific problems facing this organization, some of them harassing, but I have tried to indicate the spirit in which I shall go to the work when called upon to take part in the effort of the United Nations to justify the hopes of its members." (applause)

Jebb:

"My delegation are quite sure that the United Nations could have made no happier choice than that of Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld for the post of Sec. Gen. made vacant by the resignation of Mr. Trygve Lie whom we all know so much. Lodge: Those of us here, Mr. President, - those of us here who have the honour of knowing him personally have always, I think, shared my own impression of a strong clean-cut character, and of a man of great power, wisdom and understanding, and last but not least on behalf of the Nations United ~~States~~ Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld is Sec. Gen. He is of course no stranger to the United Nations, having represented his government here on this very session. He is also well and favourably known by many of my fellow citizens, and I may say that his quotation today from Abraham Lincoln has gone to our hearts. We also pay our tribute to .Trygve Lie who leaves such a splendid monument behind him." (applause)
