Wrecked in the Cascade Mountains by engine failure - a troop transport plane 25 soldiers. Six were killed. 19 were still living when a helicopter tropped a rescue squad. That all were not killed was because the plane's fall was broken by trees. Even then, isolated at 3,000-ft., the rest might have frozen to death if the helicopter hadn't found them. The injured were rushed back to hospital near Seattle.

The Duke of Edinburgh opened the Dockers' Sport Stadium at Breck Park, Anfield, on Merseyside. This long-standing engagement had been postponed owing to the death of Queen Mary. His Royal Highness was presented with a docker's hook, used in moving bales of cargo. Then on one of the two football pitches in the new stadium they lost much no time in getting down to sport. There are also a bowling green and a cricket pitch. The whole ground was made at the cost of 30,000-pounds. A budding press photographer made sure of his picture before the Duke said goodbye.

Rotherham welcomed a royal visitor to celebrate its
50th anniversary as a County Burreugh. Princess Margaret
was received by the Mayor. At the Parish Church the
Princess attended morning service. There were cheers when
she emerged. This was the big moment for a 9-year-old
nursing cadet, Judith Howard, who presented the bouquet.
In Sheffield the new Rowlinson Secondary School was
opened by the Princess. When the ceremony was over she
made a tour of the school and its grounds. There are
facilities for science, woodwork and metalwork, and a wise Yorkshire provision - for a good midday dinner.
