The reason for the early start on this story is that, at an unstated time, the general Press will be turned out while the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh visit the Fair. After they have gone, you will be able to resume your coverage. We shall receive from Pathe a copy of the Royal Rota coverage made during the visit of Her Majesty.

I attack a report from the Movietone representative, who contacted this story and you will see from this where it has been agreed to install lights, not only for Royal Rota coverage, but for the general coverage by all individual Companies. I gather from talking with Movietone that the idea behind the siting of the various lights is to concentrate more or less on those stands which will show movement.

I have been requested by Mr. Wright to ensure that coverage is made at Stand No. Z.3 and Z.4 (Messrs. Nathan Agran). You will see that these stands come within the lighting arrangements already made. Ask for Mr. Albert Agran.

In addition we have to cover a few scenes at Stand No. W.6. (Fillery's (G.B.) Ltd.) This stand shows a combined cleaner, polisher and scrubber. Movietone are also interested in this stand and you should contact their cameraman, George Richardson, so as to arrange a mutual time and fix up lighting. It has been suggested that Both you and Richardson should each take a few photofloods for this purpose.

One personal note - would you please see Peggie Whittemore. She, I understand, would like to try to organise a couple of shots at the stand of some Chinese gentleman with whom she is acquainted.
