All thirty seven passengers and entire crew of six of the London
-bound B.O.A.C Comet , which left Calcutta on Saturday evening for
New Delhi, were killed when the jet airliner crashed in flames in a
paddy field near JANGIPARA in Hoogly district, about 30 miles from
Calcutta. The plane crashed six minutes after taking off from the
Dum Dum airfield. The plane which arrived at Dum Dum airfield (on
Saturday) from Singapta by way of Bangkok and Rangoon, took 10 passengers
from Calcutta and left at 4-30 P.M. Indian Standard Time. It flew
straight into a storm when it reached a height of about 5,000 feet.
The storm, which gave Calcutta its first heavy rain fall of the year
was preceded by a high wind of over 60 miles an hour over Dum Dum.

On tuesday, thirty six of the 43 victims of Saturdays comet crash were buried at the Tollygung cemetry. There was a common grave for 35 victims. Only one passenger Mr. Brownswarksategaised body was identified by his brother who lives in Calcutta. There were joint services of various churches and floral wreathes by dozens were laid at the grave. Large number of diplomats and important persons attended the funeral ceremony.
