"WINGS FOR SHIPS" NAVY TESTS HYDROFOIL BOAT

On Patuxent River, in Maryland, the Hydrofoil Boat comes in for exhaustive study by the Navy.

Attaining high speeds without large increases in power is of foremost interest to naval architects and marine engineers. The Hydrofoil is like an airplane wing; it can hold a ship out of water, and in the 40-to-50 knot speed range use about half the power of the displacement boat.

Again you see the hull actually "taking off" from the Water.

"Water wings" for ships — still in the theoretical stage — but offering great hope for transforming reasonable power into high speed.
