QUEEN MOTHER AT GWELO.

- Q.M. inspects Guard of Honour supplied by Royal Rhodesian Regiment.
 View from elevated position of Main Street in Gwelo showing motor my cycle escort to Royal car which also comes into picture.
- 4. G.V. Main Street Gwelo showing portion of Royal procession driving along the decorated street.
- 5. The Royal car drives towards camera and halts outside the Gwelo Swimming Baths .
- 6. The Q.M. gets out of car to inspect detachment of R.A.F.
- 7. Q.M. inspects R.A.F. lined up in roadway. (note the large R.A.F. Training Station of Thornhill is at Gwelo, this R.A.F. station is shortly to be closed down and the personel to be returned to U.K.
- 8. After inspecting the R.A.F. men the Q.M. walks over to the pavement where the wives and children of the R.A.F. personel line the roadway. There are various shots of the Queen Mother chatting to the wives and children.
- 9. The Q.M. visits a large gathering of African Natives from Gwelo and surrounding districts. Various shots show the **Afric** Q.M. walking along the line of Africans and chatting to some of them including Native Boy Scouts etc.
- 10. The Q.M. in car drives along the great square formed by thousands of African natives and greets them as she passes by while the Natives in turn greet her with cheers and cries of welcome.
- 11. The car is seen moving towards the opening in this large gathering.
- 12. M.C.U. group of Native Chiefs in the assembly, they are dressed in long red robes with the insigna of office suspended from their necks. (short shot ran out).

ROLL NO 4.

- 1. Several shots taken from window of Royal Train as it passes through the mountainous area of the Eastern Districts nearing Umtali, also shots of African natives grouped at points along the railway line to see the White Train and wave a greeting to the Royal visitors as they pass by.
- 2. At Untali the main function is the unveiling ceremonyb of the Fairbridge Memorial at the top of Christmas Pass overlooking the town. Shot shows telephoto view of surrounding country with the White Train seen in the distance as a long thin white line as the train slowly approaches Umtali. (This shot may be out of focus owing to fault in lens).
- 3. L.S. general view of scene from Christmas Pass looking over portion of Umtali and showing some of the mountains which surround the town on all sides.
- 4. View from near site of Fairbridge Memorial, the Royal car arrives following pan of car until it stops. The background consists of xx school children cheering a welcome to the Royal Party beyond which m may be seen the distant mountainx ranges which surround Umtali.
- 5. The Q.M. alights from the car and after formal greetings ascends the steps leading to the Fairbridge Memorial, camera follows Q.M. as she ascends steps.
- 6. G.V. of the proceedings and gathering, with the splendid view of mountains in the background. At the time of taking this shot the

- 6. Q.M. was speaking with back to camera. (See details concerning Kingsley Fairbridge Memorial on page 10. of Official programme sent with last consignment of film.)

- NOTE. A series of shots covering Leopard Rock Hotel was sent to Paramount some weeks ago which might be useful for use here.
- P.S. The Q.M. and Princess Margaret stayed at Leopard Rock Hotel for two nights and one day for a rest, and was gracious enough to allow cameramen and Press photographers a private interview in the grounds of the hotel. Unfortunately Princess Margaret was unable to attend being confined to her room with a bad cold.
- NOTE. Chinyakweremba. Mountain for the purpose of publicity simplicity could be termed Leopard Rock, this is not strictly correct as the rock where lived the family of leopards is at the base of this mountain. In more recent times however the whole mountain has been associated with Leopard Rock and termed accordinly.

- 13/14. Crowd of Native children seated on ground awaiting arrival of Q.M.
- 15. G.V. assembly of mattices natives at Nyanyadzi. Nyanyadzi was originaly almost a dessert but owing to the building of a dam and an irrigation system built by the Southern Rhodesian government it has become a most fertile area to the great benefit of the natives who own and work the farms. (Note owing to heavy sha shade and adverse lighting, pictures of Q.M. were passed for a more favourable occasion).
