



ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

10 a.m.

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN AND HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH

ARRIVE AT CAERNARVON STATION, and are received by :-

Her Majesty's Lieutenant for the County of Caernarvon (Colonel William Wynne Finch, M.C.), accompanied by Mrs. Wynne Finch.

The Lord Lieutenant will present the High Sheriff of Caernarvonshire (Joseph T. Jones, Esquire) and Mrs. Jones, and His Worship the Mayor of Caernarvon (Alderman William Hughes), who will present the Mayoress (Mrs. W. Hughes).

The Mayoress will deliver a bouquet to Her Majesty.

The Mayor will present the Town Clerk of Caernarvon (W. Philip Davies, Esquire).

Her Majesty's Lieutenant will then present The Clerk of Lieutenancy (Gwilym T. Jones, Esquire), The Chief Constable of the Gwynedd Constabulary (Lieutenant-Colonel W. Jones Williams, O.B.E.), The Divisional Operating Superintendent of British Railways (H. F. Pallant, Esquire), and the District Operating Superintendent (F.H. Fisher, Esquire).

NOTE: A Royal Salute of 21 Guns will be fired by 37 H.A.A. Regt. R.A. as Her Majesty descends from the Royal Train.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will walk to the Station Yard.

The Lord Lieutenant will present Major-General E.M. Bastyan, C.B., C.B.E., G.O.C. Mid-West District.

The National Anthem will be played.

10.4 a.m.

Her Majesty will then inspect the Guard of Honour of The Royal Welch Fusiliers under the Command of Major H.G. Brougham.

Detachments from the W.R.N.S., W.R.A.C., W.R.A.F., will be drawn up in Station Square.

During the Inspection the Mayor, Mayoress, Town Clerk, the High Sheriff and his wife will precede Her Majesty through Bangor Street, Bridge Street and Castle Ditch to Caernarvon Castle, the Mayor and Mayoress proceeding to the Water Gate.

10.12 a.m.

The Royal Car, preceded by the Chief Constable of Gwynedd in the Police Escort car, will leave the Station Square for the Castle, through Bangor Street, Bridge Street, Castle Square, Castle Ditch, to the Water Gate.

CEREMONY AT THE WATER GATE.

When the Royal Car reaches the Water Gate of the Castle, and is stopped at the point which has been indicated to the Chief Constable, Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will dismount. The Equerry will mount the steps leading to the door. When Her Majesty places her foot on the lowest step a signal will be given (arranged by the Ministry of Works) to the Trumpeters on the King's Gate, who will sound a fanfare. The Equerry will then knock at the door and say :- "I demand admission in the name of the Queen." The door will then be thrown open by the Attendant (Mr. O.G. Williams) and reveal the Constable (The Right Honourable Lord Harlech, K.G., G.C.M.G.) standing within carrying the key on an Oak tray. The Constable will immediately proceed down the steps followed by the Attendant, and take up his position on the Broad Step to the right of Her Majesty (His Royal Highness standing on the Queen's left). Her Majesty will then turn to the right facing the Constable. The Constable will say: "Madam, I surrender the key of this Castle into Your Majesty's hand", to which the Queen, touching the key, will reply: "Sir Constable, I return the key of this Castle into your keeping." The Constable will then turn and hand the key on the tray to the Attendant. At this point a signal on the flag turret will be given by Mr. John Williams, and the Royal Standard and the Royal Emblem of Wales will be broken on the Eagle Tower. The Constable will conduct the Queen and The Minister will conduct the Duke of Edinburgh up the stairs into the Lower Chamber of the Eagle Tower. The Royal Suite follow and, all having entered, the Attendant with the key will bring up the rear, place the key on the table, close the door and remain there on duty. For the purpose of opening the door the Attendant will have the assistance of Mr. R.H. Roberts.

The Constable of the Castle will present Mr. Geraint G. Walters, Director for Wales of the Ministry of Works.

On reaching the top step from the Water Gate the Constable and Minister will fall back and the procession will be formed as under.

The Procession will move up the Processional Way through the Inner Bailey and the Outer Bailey till they reach the Dais.

On reaching the Dais Her Majesty and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh will move to their positions in front of the thrones.

The right column of the procession will enter the Dais on the right side and take up their positions in front of the chairs allocated to them, those leading being in the front chairs.

The left column of the procession will enter the Dais on the left side and take up their positions in front of the chairs allocated to them.

As soon as the last of the procession has moved into the Dais the Band of the Royal Marines will play, and the Choir will sing, all present standing and joining in the singing, -

X THE NATIONAL ANTHEM
X GOD SAVE THE QUEEN

Her Majesty will then seat herself and those present will do the same.

On reaching the Gate, a fanfare will be sounded, on a signal to be given by Mr. I.O. Lloyd.

Her Majesty and The Duke of Edinburgh will go unaccompanied on to the temporary Balcony where They will remain for about 3 minutes.

While Her Majesty is on the Balcony those forming the procession will so arrange themselves as to be in the same order as the original procession, as from the Water Gate to the Dais.

On Her Majesty's return from Queen Elinor's gate Madame Dilys Wynne Williams, the Conductor of the Choir, will be presented to Her Majesty.

When The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh attended by the Minister in Attendance and the Constable reach the Dais the Royal Marine Band, accompanied by the Choir, will play and sing :-

X THE WELSH NATIONAL ANTHEM. X
HEN WLAD FY NHADAU.

NOTE: Those persons who have formed the procession to Queen Elinor's Gate will not enter the Dais but will remain in their processional order to the flank of the Dais.

- 10.43 a.m. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh will then proceed down the Processional Way to the Eagle Tower, followed by the others in the Royal Procession, in the same order as before.
- 10.45 a.m. The Constable and Deputy Constable of the Castle take leave of Her Majesty and His Royal Highness, who enter the Royal car and leave by the Water Gate, and, preceded by the police escort car, commence their drive via Castle Ditch, Bridge Street, Bangor Street, and through Caernarvonshire via
