**7.** At Odiham in Hampshire the youngest of the Services, the Royal Air Force, was on parade for the Coronation Review by Her Majesty the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh.

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Among the hundreds of guests seated in the neighbourhood of the saluting base as the Queen inspected the parade were air attaches from many foreign embassies, including eleven representatives from Soviet Russia who saw spread out on the airfield before them the long lines of aircraft representing every branch of the Service.
