Yachtsmen of Cowes are hoping that with the new Royal Yacht coming into commission the Queen as well as the Duke 100A red to edd to will attend future events.

The Duke will live on board the 68-ton motor yacht Fair-wood, while he is at Cowes and will concentrate on the racing side of the regatta.

He will race the Dragon yacht Bluebottle—a wedding present to himself and the Queen from the Island Sailing Club—and the Fiying Fifteen class Coweslip, a personal gift from the people of

Last year he won a second prize with Coweslip and a third with Bluebottle in the only two races in which he competed.

LONDON DAY BY DAY The Duke's Week at Cowes : Money Maladministered

THE Duke of Edinburgh will be at Cowes this year from Aug. 2 to Aug. 8. I understand that he has chartered a 68-ton motor yacht, the Fairwood, and that he will live on board, concentrating on the racing rather than the social side of Cowes. The Fairwood is owned by Mr. S. J. Jeffery.

The Duke will also be able to use the Fairwood as a parent craft for his two racing boats. Bluebettle and Coweslip. These make a remarkable contrast to the Royal craft of the old days at Cowes. King Edward and King George V raced in the big class in Britannia, a cutter of 221 tons, with a crew of some 25 hands.
